Academic Approach:

Boarding at Taunton School:

Each pupil (boarding or day) is attached to a House, which is not only the centre for administration and recreation, but is also, and most importantly, a pastoral base. Pupils develop great loyalty to their Houses, whilst understanding that they are part of the whole school community.

The Housemaster or Housemistress (boarding Houseparents are resident in the House) is primarily responsible for pupils' daily well-being and progress, and is the first point of contact for parents - at any time.

Outside the Classroom:

Sport, and the benefits of exercise, is well known and that plays an important part of life at Taunton School. There are also opportunities available through the Arts - Music, Drama, Public Speaking - and the challenges offered by Outdoor Activities - CCF, Ten Tors, Duke of Edinburgh Award.
