It is built on the ancient site of Faversham Abbey and adjacent to St Mary of Charity Church with its Christopher Wren spire and Abbey Street with its fine collection of medieval and Georgian houses. The town of Faversham lies at the end of Faversham Creek, an inlet from the Thames and near to the North Downs with some of the most beautiful countryside in the South East of England.
